SUPPORT TEAM REGULATIONS

1/32 Finals: November 9 – November 14, 2023

1/16 Finals: November 15 – 20, 2023

1/8 Finals: November 20 – 25, 2023

Quarter-Finals: November 26 – December 1, 2023

Semi-Final & Final: December 2 – 3, 2023

Las Palmas, Gran Canaria, Canary Islands

1 GENERAL

- 1.1 These Support Team Regulations ("STR") shall always apply while support persons are at the venue, ashore or on or around the race area during the event days.
- 1.2 The STR shall apply from the following times:

Round	From	To
1/32 Final	0800 on November 10 th	1800 on November 14 th
1/16 Final	0800 on November 16 th	1800 on November 20 th
/8 Final	0800 on November 21 st	1800 on November 25 th
1/4 Final	0800 on November 27 th	1800 on December 1 st
Semi-Final & Final	0800 on December 2 nd	1800 on December 3 rd

- 1.3 In these STR and the rules governing the event the following definitions apply:
- 1.3.1 "Support person" has the meaning given in the Racing Rules of Sailing;
- 1.3.2 "Support team" means all support persons associated with a SSL National Team and its members or athletes.
- 1.4 An alleged breach of any of the STR may be referred to the International Jury for a hearing. As a result of the hearing, the International Jury may take action under RRS 64.5 or may instruct the Organising Authority to withdraw accreditation and access rights from the offending party, with or without the option of substitution, either for a specified period or for the remainder of the competition. Note also that action may be taken under RRS 69.2.
- 1.5 The Organising Authority may change these regulations at any time. Any changes will be posted on the Official Notice Board.

2 SAILING VENUE

- 2.1 Only support boats provided by the Organising Authority, if any, will be allowed at the event.

3 DRONES

- 3.1 The use of drones by SSL National Teams is prohibited over the race area from the first warning signal of the day until the last race of the day has finished or the race committee signals no more races today, whichever is the later.
